# Northwest Reno Library Event Details

**Wednesday, February 1 & 15 1 - 3 p.m. Lifescapes** Lifescapes meets the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month. In this program, Seniors are given an opportunity to write and share their memoirs. New members are always welcome. Lifescapes is a project sponsored by the Washoe County Library System, Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI), and the Department of English at the University of Nevada, Reno.

**Wednesday, February 1 5 - 6 p.m. Speaker Series - Heart Attack Survivor - Lori Patch** As an active mother, Reno resident Lori Patch was an avid runner and cyclist, but two years ago she was rushed to the hospital after her lips and fingers started to turn blue and her chest started to tighten. She was having a heart attack. Lori later discovered she had a rare condition that sometimes affects athletes. She will talk about surviving heart attacks, heart disease and the differences in symptoms between men and women.

**Saturday, February 4 1 - 3 p.m. Black History Month "O Freedom"** UNR Professor of African American History Greta de Jong presents *You Can't Eat Freedom: Struggles for Social Justice After the Civil Rights Movement*. Black activism continued beyond the 1960s in efforts to secure economic reforms aimed at creating jobs, improving social services, and enabling all citizens to lead lives of dignity and autonomy. The story of these efforts, and the opposition they encountered from white supremacists, sheds light on current issues such as persistent racism and the plight of working-class communities—black and white—that were devastated by job losses and economic decline in the decades after the 1960s. Followed by Patricia Gallimore, president of the Reno/Sparks NAACP, who will talk about local and national issues.

**Wednesday, February 15 5 - 6:30 p.m. Eclectic Evening Book Club** This month the book club discusses *Dead Wake: The Last Crossing of the Lusitania* by Erik Larson (2016). The Lusitania, a British luxury passenger liner, was torpedoed out of the water off the coast of Ireland by a German U-Boat in 1915. The ship sank in just 18 minutes, with nearly 1,200 people, including 128 Americans, losing their lives. Germany had declared the seas around Britain to be a war zone and for months German U-boats wreaked havoc in the North Atlantic. At the same time, an ultra-secret British intelligence unit had been tracking that particular U-boat, but did not share that information with anyone.

**Saturday, February 18 11 a.m. - noon ME2 LAB (Mobile Engineering Education Lab)** UNR students present engineering topics to your school aged kids with fun and fascinating hands-on demonstrations. Included are discussions on going to college, engineering majors, careers in engineering, and why math and science are important.
