Melisa Maxey, Entrepreneur, Small Business Owner and community activist, learned about PLARN by accident. While living in Florida, her husband brought home a unique hat he found on the beach. It was made from plastic bags. Soon after, Melisa made her first PLARN beach bag, which she used to pick up trash in the community. Trash pick-up on the beach led to volunteering for a local sea turtle rescue organization and environmental studies. Today, Melisa is driven to educate the general public about the environmental dangers of plastic bags through a program called the PLARNit Project.

### Sunday, April 30

1—2:30 p.m.—**Historic Reno Preservation Society Presents: ZoAnn Campana on the Newlands District** In 1889, Francis Newlands built his residence on a sagebrush-choked bluff overlooking the Truckee River. In the decades following, Senator Newlands and his real estate company laid out a series of subdivisions featuring picturesque landscapes, winding boulevards, and a mix of vernacular and high-style residences. These subdivisions are known collectively as the Newlands neighborhood, which has remained a jewel of community planning and design in Reno since its earliest development. Architectural historian ZoAnn Campana recently completed a historic resources survey and National Register nomination for the Newlands Heights Historic District in old Southwest Reno and will be sharing her findings. ZoAnn Campana is an architectural historian and historic preservation consultant in Northern Nevada.
