### Historic Reno Preservation Society

Kelly Rigby and Joyce Cox present "Flick Ranch"

Margaret Flick and family bought the property from Mrs. C. W. Mapes in 1941. The ranch house was purchased by the Reno Catholic Diocese in 1948 to become the first Bishop Manogue High School. In 1958, the Brothers of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary moved into the house using it as their monastery for the next 39 years. The Truckee River Flood Project bought the ranch house and property in 2007 planning to terrace the land to reduce flooding, requiring demolition of the ranch house. Kelly Rigby, President of the Flick Ranch Project, is attempting to save the Flick ranch house from demolition.
