2006: a record-breaking year

Over the Top in 2006!

The record-breaking numbers:

- Washoe County Library System patrons checked out more than **two million items** for the first time ever.
- Library visits increased **15.3%** from the previous year.
- Program attendance was up **15.1%**.
- Computer use by our patrons increased **53.3%**.
- Use of our Internet library went up **30.6%**.



Highlights of Our Year:

- Library hours were increased, and **seven-day-a-week service** is now available at five branch libraries.
- Fines on overdue youth materials were eliminated, in an effort to see that materials are returned and to encourage children to continue to use the library.
- Library patrons contributed more than **\$6,014** to help rebuild the New Orleans public libraries that were damaged or destroyed by Hurricane Katrina.
- More than **10,000** people viewed the nationally touring exhibit, "Anne Frank: A History for Today," at the Downtown Reno Library.
- A multimedia exhibition by Michael Nye, "A Fine Line: Mental Health/Mental Illness," was displayed at Northwest Reno Library.
- Summer Reading Program set a new record with **6,789** children participating.
- The Traveling Tales Story Van reached **8,379** children who might not be able to visit a library building.
- A Community Resource Center was established to provide information and referrals to a broad range of community services.
- An online GED study program is now available at the Community Resource Center.
- Participants in Lifescapes, a writing and publishing program for seniors, published nine books and took part in **83** gatherings.
- Nearly **2,000** patrons received free tax help at seven branches through AARP and VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance.)
- Library staff visited **187** third grade classes, distributing more than **4,964** library bags.
- There were **14,480** calls to Dial-a-Story, and **3,684** calls to Dial-a-Story in Spanish.
- Public wireless Internet access is now available.

The Friends also enjoyed a record year, allocating more than \$155,000 to library projects. The organization, which currently has 1,200+ members, has raised more than \$2 million since 1991.

The Friends' Second Century Endowment Fund reached its first goal of \$200,000, now giving the public a way to make a long-term commitment to benefit the library.
